## Working with Adults who Self-Neglect – Using the Research Evidence in Practice

A 1-day course

#### Course Outline:

This one-day course is a follow-up to the half-day workshops that presented summaries of the research evidence on working with adults who self-neglect. It will provide a refresh on the research evidence. It will also focus on recent published safeguarding adult reviews. The research evidence and the findings and recommendations from safeguarding adult reviews will give participants an opportunity to explore the strengths and vulnerabilities in local systems, and the practice challenges that they experience.

The focus will then turn to case studies. Each case study will enable participants to conduct a systemic analysis of different layers and their interfaces – direct work with the individual adult; organisational factors that influence how practitioners and managers work; how practitioners and agencies work together; and the role of the Safeguarding Adults Board. They will enable participants to reflect on the contribution of local policies and protocols, to consider legal interventions and to identify good practice, for example in balancing self-determination and autonomy with a duty of care. Particular emphasis will be given to skills in building relationships with adults who self-neglect, including the use of particular types of questions that seek to explore what might lie behind their situation.

The day will conclude with a focus on action planning for practice development, objective setting so that participants can maintain their professional development in this area of practice.
